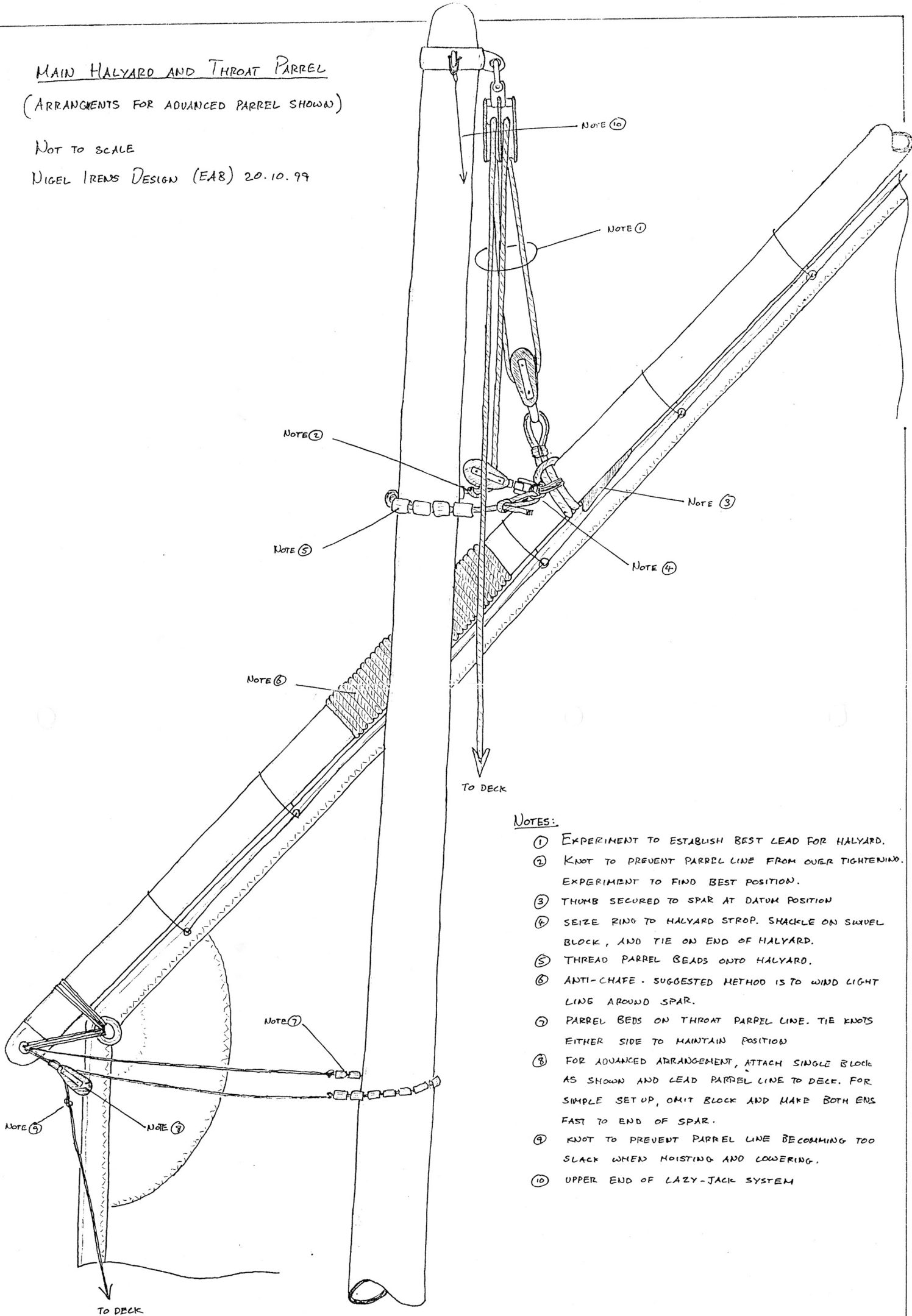


MAIN HALYARD AND THROAT PARREL

(ARRANGEMENTS FOR ADVANCED PARREL SHOWN)

NOTES:

- ① EXPERIMENT TO ESTABLISH BEST LEAD FOR HALYARD.
- ② KNOT TO PREVENT PARREL LINE FROM OVER TIGHTENING. EXPERIMENT TO FIND BEST POSITION.
- ③ THUMB SECURED TO SPAR AT DATUM POSITION
- ④ SEIZE RING TO HALYARD STROP. SHACKLE ON SWIVEL BLOCK, AND TIE ON END OF HALYARD.
- ⑤ THREAD PARREL BEADS ONTO HALYARD.
- ⑥ ANTI-CHAFE. SUGGESTED METHOD IS TO WIND LIGHT LINE AROUND SPAR.
- ⑦ PARREL BEDS ON THROAT PARREL LINE. TIE KNOTS EITHER SIDE TO MAINTAIN POSITION
- ⑧ FOR ADVANCED ARRANGEMENT, ATTACH SINGLE BLOCK AS SHOWN AND LEAD PARREL LINE TO DECK. FOR SIMPLE SET UP, OMIT BLOCK AND MAKE BOTH ENDS FAST TO END OF SPAR.
- ⑨ KNOT TO PREVENT PARREL LINE BECOMING TOO SLACK WHEN HOISTING AND LOWERING.
- ⑩ UPPER END OF LAZY-JACK SYSTEM
